Entre Danzas y Paisajes (Within Dances and Landscapes) Friday, September 16, 2022, 7:30 p.m.

After a season opening reception beginning at 6:30 p.m., join pianist **David Córdoba** and flautist **Elizabeth Osorio** for an evening of music from Latin America. Born in Medellin (Colombia), David has performed at different venues in Latin America and The United States. His interest in Latin American contemporary music has led him to premiere chamber music works in various festivals in Chili and Colombia. Recently, he was invited to open the 2021 season of the Memphis Symphony Orchestra playing the Beethoven Concerto No. 2 for Piano and Orchestra, under the baton of Robert Moody. Joining David is Colombian flautist, Elizabeth Osorio, who has recently performed in Paris and New York City.





Steuterman-Hardison Organ Recital: Simon Johnson Friday, October 21, 2022, 7:30 p.m.

Simon Johnson is one of the most versatile musicians of his generation, successfully combining life as a virtuoso organist with extensive work in choral direction, composition and arrangement. In September 2021 he became Master of Music at Westminster Cathedral, responsible for its world-famous choir. For 13 years he was the Organist and Assistant Director of Music at St Paul's Cathedral, and was involved in all the national occasions that took place there. A festive reception follows in the Great Hall, sponsored by the Monypeny and Hardison families.




A Centennial Celebration: Handel's *Messiah* Wednesday, December 21, 2022, 7:30 p.m.



One hundred years ago, in December, 1922, Calvary's Organist-Choirmaster Adolph Steuterman presented Handel's *Messiah* in its entirety for the first time in Memphis since the late 1800s. Reportedly, 800 people attended, overflowing out into Second Street, and hundreds more were turned away. A local radio station broadcasted it live. Since then, *Messiah* has been performed at Calvary more than eighty times by Steuterman and his successors John Hooker, David Kienzle, John Wright, Thomas Pavlechko, and Sumner Jenkins. The Calvary Choir was often augmented with singers in the Memphis area, and they were always accompanied by orchestra.

In celebration of that tradition, Calvary is delighted to offer *Messiah* once again. The Calvary Choir will partner with the Memphis Symphony Orchestra, under the baton of Robert Moody. This free concert is generously offered to the community in loving memory of Bob Brown, sponsored by Richard Tanner. Priority reservations for this free event will be accepted from October 15th through November 7th at **s**.







Mockingbird Early Music Ensemble Friday, February 10, 2023, 7:30 p.m.

The Mockingbird Early Music Ensemble was formed in 2003, and is based in Oxford, Mississippi. The group is composed of enthusiastic proponents of the historically informed presentation of music created before 1750, played on recreations of original instruments which are found in museums throughout Europe. These include recorders, viole da gamba, harpsichord, and organ. Come early at 6:30 p.m. for a light reception before the concert.

Choir of Clare College, Cambridge Friday April 21, 2023, 7:30 p.m.

Since the founding of a mixed voice choir in 1972, the Choir of Clare College has gained an international reputation as one of the world's leading university choirs. In addition to its primary function of leading services three times a week in the College chapel, the Choir keeps an active schedule recording, broadcasting, and performing. Former directors have included John Rutter and Timothy Brown. Under the direction of Graham Ross, Director of Music since 2010, it has been praised for its consistently 'thrilling' and 'outstanding' performances worldwide.
